From 20th to 25th November 2006 the top 50 photos will be displayed in the Bannerman Centre during One World Week.

Terms and Conditions

1. Picture requirement

1.1 Theme and amount

Pictures can be of any subject relating to China or Chinese culture. However, they must be lawful—That is, they must not be illegal under the law of Britain or China. Should any photograph be deemed of an illegal nature, your competition entry will be cancelled and you may be liable for prosecution.

Each entrant may only submit a maximum of 2 photographs to the competition.

If you wish to share further photographs, they will only be displayed on the Internet. Please note that the size rule does not apply to those photographs not entered into the competition.

1.2 Description

The picture for competition must have a name, which is also the name of your picture's file. Please keep the name as short as possible.

Any story accompanying each picture should be as short as possible, as there may not be enough room to print them. The story is not included in the evaluation of the competition, but it can help others to understand and enjoy your picture. The story should be written in English (if you are Chinese, you can also write a Chinese version, but DO note that the English version is essential).

The picture for competition must be the original one. If modulated by software, there should be no words, letters and other ornamental elements on it.

1.3 Format

The picture format should be JPG, JPEG, BMP and GIF ONLY. NO other format is acceptable.

2. Submit

Photographs to be entered into the competition must be submitted by Email, as an attachment. The name of the picture file should be "competition picture No.1 (or 2) from XXX" (Where "XXX" is your real name, please write in English). There should also be a word file, which will include the following information: your name in English (and in Chinese if you are Chinese); your preferred pen name (if you wish this to be shown against your photos instead of your real name), your usual mail address; contact number or e-mail address; your pictures' name related to the picture number; a short introduction or story relating to the pictures. The word file should be named "competition information".

If you like to send them in an electronic folder, please name it as "competition pictures from XXX" (where XXX should be your real name). The folder must be compressed with ZIP or WINRAR, and sent by Email in the attachment.

3. Copyright

Copyright belongs to original author.

For those pictures not for competition, you should at least make sure you have the right to use the pictures. The consequence caused by copyright will be your full responsibility. We do not have the responsibility and resources to examine the picture's copyright.

Please note that by submitting photos for the competition or exhibition, you automatically give permission for us to use the photos as we deem necessary. Your copyright is not affected

4. Other Important Notices

As we don't charge you for print and production fees for the pictures, please understand that there is a limit to the number of pictures that can be exhibited in the library.

All photographs will be kept in the archives of Great Wall Society (CSSA Brunel). If you don't want your pictures to be in the files, please let us know. We confirm that we will not use them for commercial purpose.
